EXAMPLE – Journal article without an available DOI [Publication Manual of the APA, 2010, p. 199]

Physical Education, 17(4), 12-14. Retrieved from

(note: Locate the URL of the journal by using a search engine such as Google. If not located there use the URL of the homepage of the database.)

EXAMPLE - ERIC DOCUMENT – ERIC database [Publication Manual of the APA, 2010, p. 192]

Some archival documents (discontinued journals, monographs, dissertations, or papers not formally published) can only be found in electronic databases such as ERIC or JSTOR. When the document is not easily located through its primary publishing channels, give the home or entry page URL for the online archive. See APA p. 204, number 22 for an example and APA p. 212, number 62 for an example.
